Judging Order – Kittens, Cats, Showmanship, Decorated Cages, Catless Cat

Check Out – Cats and decorated cages- after the show. Class D entries – between 6:30 and 7:30 p.m. the Sunday of the fair.

Additional Rules of Entry:

- Youth eligible to exhibit in this department are those enrolled in a 4-H Cat project, or other youth groups carrying a similar program as their supervised project.
- Cats may be purebred, household pets or of mixed breeding.
- Kittens must be four months old by show date.
- All health requirements must be met before the animals are entered. *Animal Health Regulations for Fairs and Shows in Wisconsin* section of the premium book.
 - All cats must have documentation of current immunizations for distemper, rhinotracheitis, calici and rabies. Most recent immunization must be not less than 30 days prior to show date.
 - Any cat display having any contagious disease, parasites or symptoms will not be allowed to show.
- Cats must be brought to the fair properly controlled. They must be collared/haltered and leashed, or in a carrier.
- Members will be required to bring their own animals to the judging table. Judging will include general appearance and condition, temperament and proper handling, hair coat, paws, nails and body build.
- Definitions:
 - Long Hair: Hair coat more than 1" in length.
 - Short Hair: Hair Coat 1" or less in length.
- All adult males being shown must be neutered.
- Mixed breed and purebred cats will show together unless numbers in class warrant splitting classes.
- Cat's toenails must be clipped.
- Exhibitors are expected to wear white, long-sleeved shirts or blouses and may be graded down if not in proper attire.
