

Department 714 – Plant And Soil Science

Department Requirements:

- All produce exhibited must be from the current year's crop and are the result of the exhibitor's own work.
- Refer to UW Extension Publication A3306, Exhibiting and Judging Vegetables for guidelines on selecting, cleaning and trimming vegetables for exhibit. Garden vegetables are judged according to guidelines contained in Publication A3306. It can be viewed or purchased on-line at <http://learningstore.uwex.edu/pdf/A3306.pdf>.
- Fruits and vegetables need to be cleaned but not washed. Dirty or spoiled produce will be disqualified.
- The number of specimens to be exhibited is in parenthesis behind each lot description.

Class A – Vegetables - Premium Code D

- Plant material only may be used to create exhibit. No artificial or non-organic materials.
- Item must be three dimensional – a sculpture
- Exhibit may represent human, animal or inanimate objects – automobile, airplane, tractor, robot, etc.
