**Entry Day** – 1 p.m. – 8 p.m. Wednesday before entry day of fair

**Judging Day** – Wednesday of fair

**Judging Time** – 1 p.m. – 8 p.m., face to face judging only

**Check Out-** Begins at 4:00 p.m. on Sunday with loading of Steers from Sale of Champions to be leaving before all other animals. All animals must be removed by 6:30 p.m. except for the Swine that leave Monday morning.

### ADDITIONAL RULES OF ENTRY

- Youth enrolled in a 4-H, FFA, or other youth groups in a supervised fruit and/or vegetable project are eligible to participate in this project.
- All produce exhibited must be from the current year's crop and from the exhibitor's own or family garden.
- Vegetable exhibitors are limited to listing no more than 10 vegetables on the fair entry form plus a vegetable box.
- **Refer to UW-Extension Publication A3306, Exhibiting and Judging Vegetables for guidelines on selecting, cleaning and trimming vegetables for exhibit. Information in that guide will be followed for judging unless specified differently in the premium list. - Dirty or spoiled produce will be disqualified.
