## **REQUIREMENTS:**

- Eligibility requirements for exhibitors in the open class goat show are outlined in the General Rules and General Rules & Regulations for Junior Open, Open, and Nursing Home Resident Division sections of the Oconto County Fair premium list.
- All health requirements must be met before the animals are entered. See Health Requirements Section of the fair premium list.
- All Open Class goat entries must be received by the Fair, and must be checked in with the superintendent between 5:00 and 7:00 p.m. on the Wednesday before entry day of the Fair.
- For class definitions, see Chapter ATCP 160.08 and 160.09 sections of the fair premium list.
- The Oconto County open goat show is a ribbon only event--no premiums will be paid.
- Open Class dairy goats will follow the Junior show and Kiddie Showmanship on Saturday of the Fair.
- No bucks may be exhibited
- Animals exhibited in the Junior Fair Show cannot be shown in Open Class.
- Check out begins at 4:00 p.m. on Sunday with loading of Steers from Sale of Champions to Maplewood Meats leaving before all other animals. All animals must be removed by 6:30 p.m. except for the swine that leave Monday morning.
