

# Department - 814 - Plant and Soil Science

### **REGULATIONS:**

- Eligibility requirements for exhibitors are outlined in the General Rules of the Oconto County Fair and General Rules and Regulations for Junior Open, Open, and Nursing Home Resident Exhibitor documents in the Oconto County Fair premium list.
- Hay exhibits must be thoroughly cured and haylage must be fermented.
- Dry hay exhibits should be a 4 inch thick slice from a small square bale or equivalent amount cut from a large round or square bale and placed in a clear plastic bag.
- Haylage and silage exhibits should be a full, one gallon sized zipper lock clear bag.
- Small grain exhibits should be a full, one gallon-sized zipper lock clear bag. Label with variety.
- Small grain sheaves should be 3 to 4 inches in diameter. Label with variety.
- Corn grain must be shown on the cob, husked, and labeled with hybrid and maturity.
- Corn stalks must include root placed in plastic bag. Stalks must be tied and labeled with hybrid and maturity
- Garden display must include 5 vegetables from the following list (number of each type specified)

0	Beans, green or wax	10	0	Onion, sweet or storage	3
0	Beets	3	0	Onion, green – scallion	5
0	Cabbage, any type	1	0	Parsley, potted plant	1
0	Corn, sweet	3 ears	0	Pepper, sweet, green or red	2
0	Carrots,	3	0	Radish, any type	5
0	Cucumbers, any type	5	0	Tomatoes, green or red	3

- Garden vegetables are judged according to guidelines contained in UW-Extension Publication 3306 –
  <u>Exhibiting and Judging Vegetables</u>, which can be viewed or purchased on-line at

- Root Vegetables tips to be 1-2 inches long and tap roots cut to ½ 1 inch in length and clean
- Tree and small fruit exhibits must be accompanied by a card identifying the variety of fruit.
- All exhibits must be from the current year's crop, except corn silage may be from last year's crop.

### CLASS A - FORAGE Premium Code B

• Include label with names of herbs for both display and individual exhibits
