ADDITIONAL RULES OF ENTRY

- Youth eligible to exhibit in this department are those enrolled in 4-H Dog project, or any approved dog project groups.
- Youth eligible to exhibit in this department must attend at least one training night hosted by the Project Superintendent, unless making prior arrangements with the dog project leaders.
- The Open Class Dog Obedience judging will be held after the Junior Dog Obedience High Point Award Announcement.
- All dogs will go home on the same day of the show.
- To maintain illness prevention, all dog feces must be picked up immediately after your dog eliminates it. Failure to clean up after your dog will result in a forfeit of the exhibitor's premiums.
- All health requirements must be met before the animals are entered. See *Animal Health Regulations for Fairs and Shows in Wisconsin: 2018* section of the premium book.
- All dogs are required to have the following vaccines: Distemper, Hepatitis, Leptospirosis, Parainfluenza, Parvovirus, and Rabies. All dogs are recommended to have the Bordetella vaccine. All vaccines must be administered or up to date, at least 30 days before the show date. A copy of the dog's vaccine certificate will be required at check-in unless a current copy of vaccinations was given to the dog project leaders prior to the show.
- Females in season can be shown on the date of the dog show. However, a four-hour notice must be given to the superintendent(s); Females in season can show while wearing pants at the conclusion of judging the other classes. Females in season must be kept outside until the judge has concluded with the other classes.
- In the show ring dogs must wear either a slip collar or a fitted flat collar. Leashes must be either leather, nylon, or biothane and have a length of 6 feet. Dogs are not allowed off-leash unless being judged. To maintain safety and control of a dog, training collars will be allowed outside of the show ring.
- Showmanship leads and collars are required to be worn in the Showmanship class.
- Exhibitors earning the first blue award in an obedience level must enter at least the next highest level the following year.

AWARDS

SALE OF CHAMPIONS ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS AND PROCEDURES

- Youth enrolled in a 4-H, FFA or other youth group in a supervised dog obedience training project are eligible to participate in this sale if qualifications are met.
- Exhibitors earning the High Point award are eligible to sell in the Sale of Champions if the exhibitor is qualified. The exhibitor and/or their family is responsible for providing an item to represent the champion in the sale.
- Exhibitors must have completed and turned in for verification a dog obedience project record that has been approved for use by the Oconto County Fair (4-H dog project record and FFA record or proficiency award application qualify, any other record forms should be submitted to the Fair board in advance for approval).
- Exhibitors must have entered and participated in the appropriate showmanship class for his/her age to qualify.
- Exhibitors must certify that they have participated in a minimum of three training, or educational activities; or the equivalent, during the current project year. To qualify a dog to sell an item at the sale one educational activity must be specific to dogs. See *Educational Point Requirements for Oconto County Fair Animal Project Exhibitors* document in this premium book for details.
- Exhibitors may sell only one item in the Sale of Champions. An individual qualifying more than one exhibit for the sale will elect the exhibit they wish to sell; the second blue from the class not selected by the champion will then be eligible to sell. Exhibits must earn a blue ribbon to be eligible to sell.
- Exhibitors selling in the Sale of Champions will receive the amount bid for their exhibit minus a percentage determined by the Fair Board. The percentage covers awards, advertising and other expenses of the performance project and sale.

OTHER AWARDS

- Trophies will be awarded to individuals receiving top blue awards in showmanship and to the individuals earning Pre-Novice High Point and High Point (Novice and above).
- The Best of Show is awarded to the exhibitor earning High Point – Novice and Above

CLASS C – Rally (Ribbon Only)

Rally Beginner:	All exercises are performed with the dog on leash. There is a requirement of 10-15 stations to complete with no more than five stationary exercises. The exercises performed vary from turning 360 degrees to changing paces during the course. Exhibitors are permitted to talk, praise, encourage, clap their hands, pat their legs, or use any verbal means of encouragement. Multiple commands and/or signals using one or both arms and hands are allowed; the handler's arms need not be maintained in any position at any time. The handler may not touch the dog or make physical corrections. At any time during the performance, loud or harsh commands or intimidating signals will be penalized.
Rally Advanced:	All exercises are performed with the dog off leash. There is a requirement of 12-17 stations to complete with no more than five stationary exercises. The exercises performed vary from turning 360 degrees to changing paces during the course. Exhibitors are permitted to talk, praise, encourage, clap their hands, pat their legs, or use any verbal means of encouragement. Multiple commands and/or signals using one or both arms and hands are allowed; the handler's arms need not be maintained in any position at any time. The handler may not touch the dog or make physical corrections. At any time during the performance, loud or harsh commands or intimidating signals will be penalized.

CLASS D – Agility (Ribbon Only)

Date & Location of Trial – TBA

- You may only compete in **one** class at the date of trial.
- The day of trial, you will be placed in the correct height jump class
- Dogs may only be shown with either a fitted buckle collar (no tags) or no collar.

Beginner JTT, JTTW, & Standard:	Beginner classes are for dogs who are not ready to be off leash or for youth that have been doing agility for less than 2 years . All dogs must be leashed with either a 4-foot or 6-foot nylon or leather leash. For the standard class a 6-foot leash will be required.
Intermediate JTT, JTTW, & Standard:	Intermediate classes are for dogs and youth that have a minimum of 2 years' experience competing in Agility. Once the youth and dog have entered the ring, the dog's leash must be removed and handed to the ring steward.
